



Context

Be.DiSSCo-FED is the federal contribution to the establishment of a strong Belgian node in the pan-european DiSSCo research infrastructure. It brings together directly or indirectly all the current Belgian partners of DiSSCo. It focuses on:

- *Governance*: Federation of the Institutions and their collections as a DiSSCo National Node.
- *Services*: Development and use of the *Specialization Tool* and the *Collection Registry* to identify and valorize collection and institutions assets.
- *Capacity Building*: Train researchers on collection management tools and specimen digitization techniques. Engage citizen scientists in the expansion and the documentation of natural history collections.

Provide insights and updates on DiSSCo Research Infrastructure & DiSSCo Belgium, give the floor to digitized collections managers and users, learn how to contribute and how to benefit from the infrastructure.




